C: Name of uniform part: Senior shirt

Conditions on how to wear it:

Must be ironed and have a military press and pattern. Sleeves are to be rolled up for day dress or not rolled and buttoned for ceremonial. It must be tucked in neatly and must be clean.

Conditions on how to wear it: Worn slightly tilted on the left side of the head with 2 fingers above the left ear and 1 finger above the left eyebrow (TRUE / FALSE)

D: Name of uniform part: _____

Conditions on how to wear it: Worn around the left shoulder above the epaulettes, sling passing under the belt on the right with the resting on the right hip. Bottom edge of the pouch should be in line with the lower edge of the belt. (TRUE / FALSE)

Awards that are worn on the left arm, consists of badges that are awarded for your service in the company. Eg. One year service, Junior section service, etc.

Awards that are worn on the left arm. It consist of awards like the scholastic award, president's award, NCO proficiency award etc.
